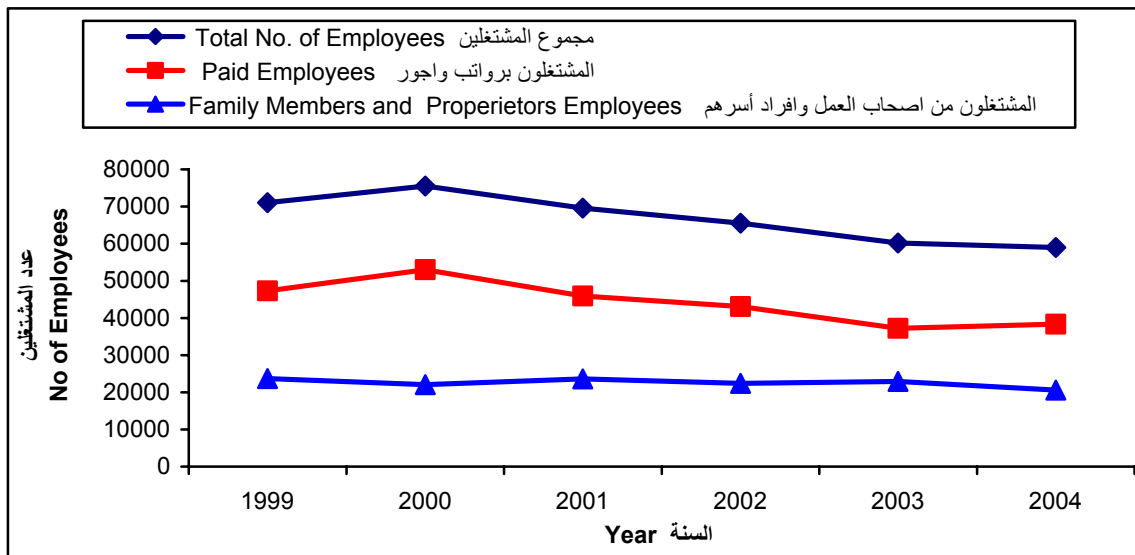

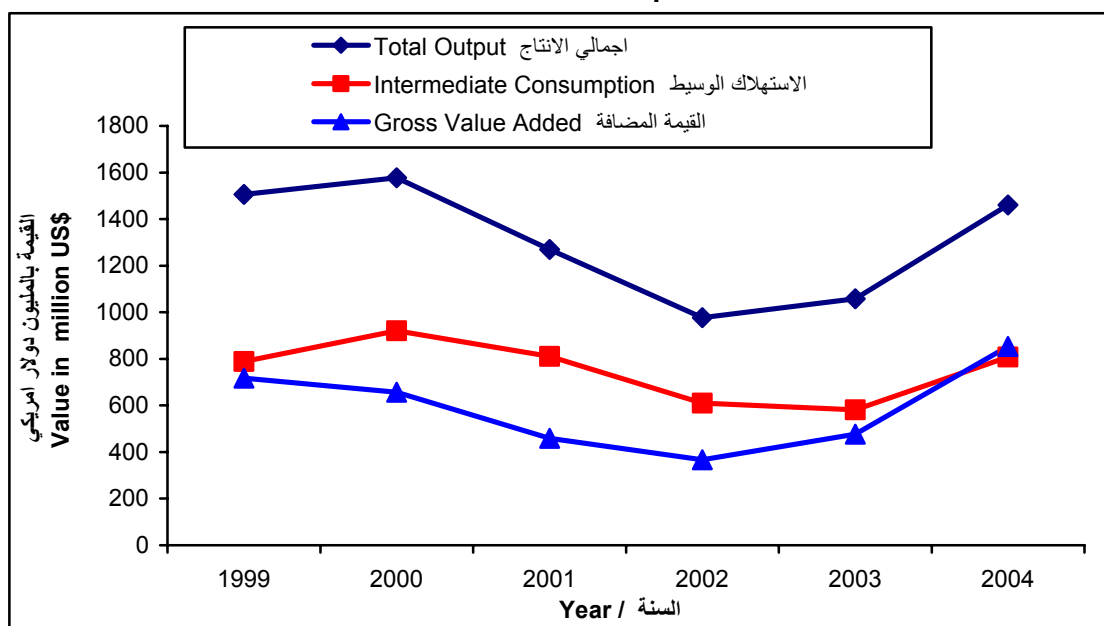
**Figure(1): Total Number of Employees in Industrial Activities by Type of Work in Remaining West Bank and Gaza Strip 1999-2004**

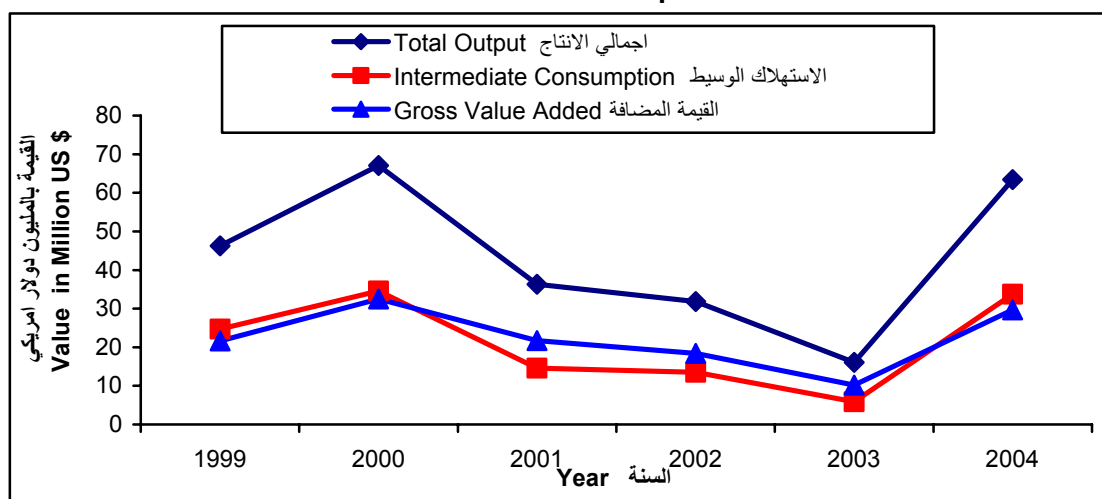

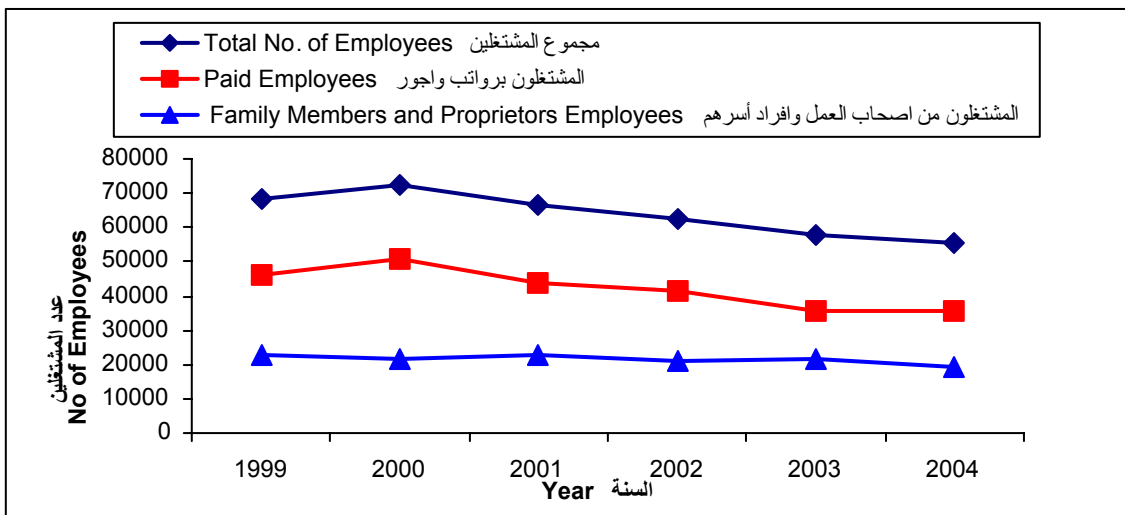

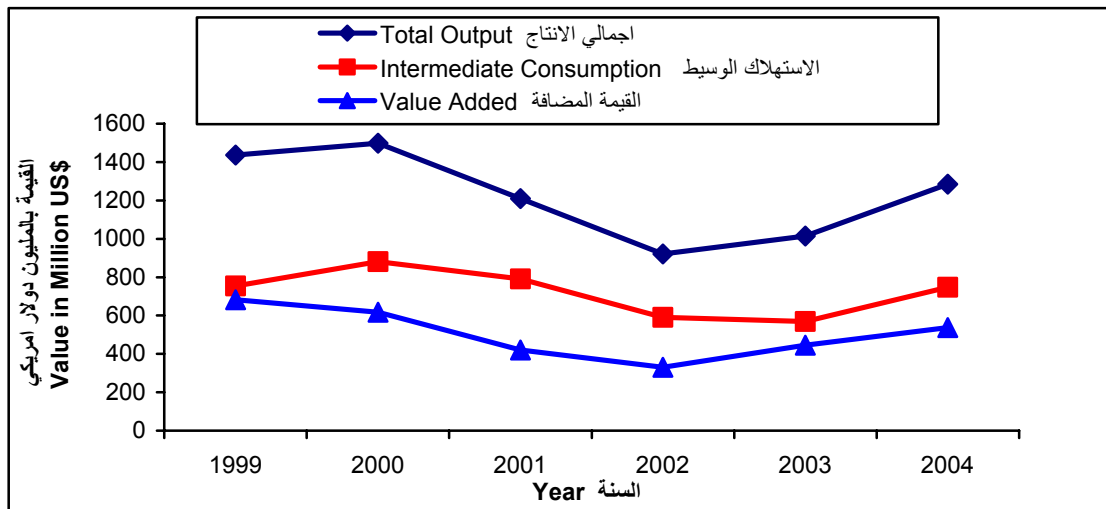

**Figure (6): Main Economic Indicators of Manufacturing Activities in Remaining West Bank and Gaza Strip 1999 – 2004**



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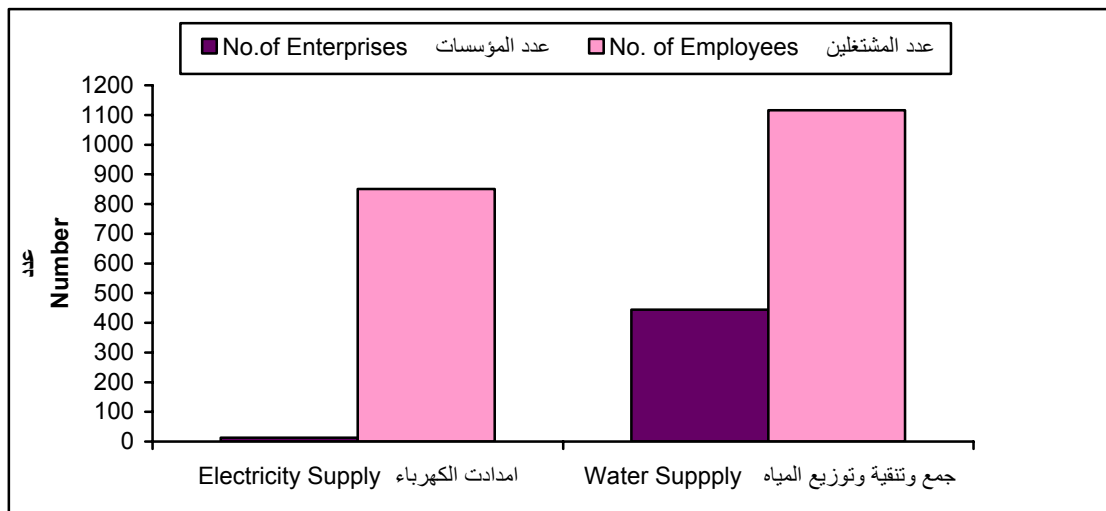

**Figure (7): Distribution of Enterprises and Employees of Electricity and Water Supply Activities in Remaining West Bank and Gaza Strip, 2004**



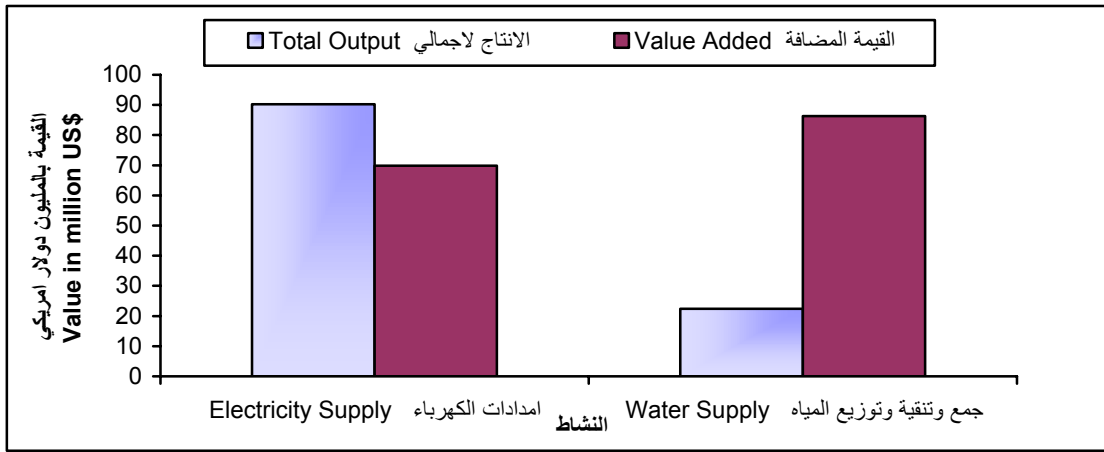

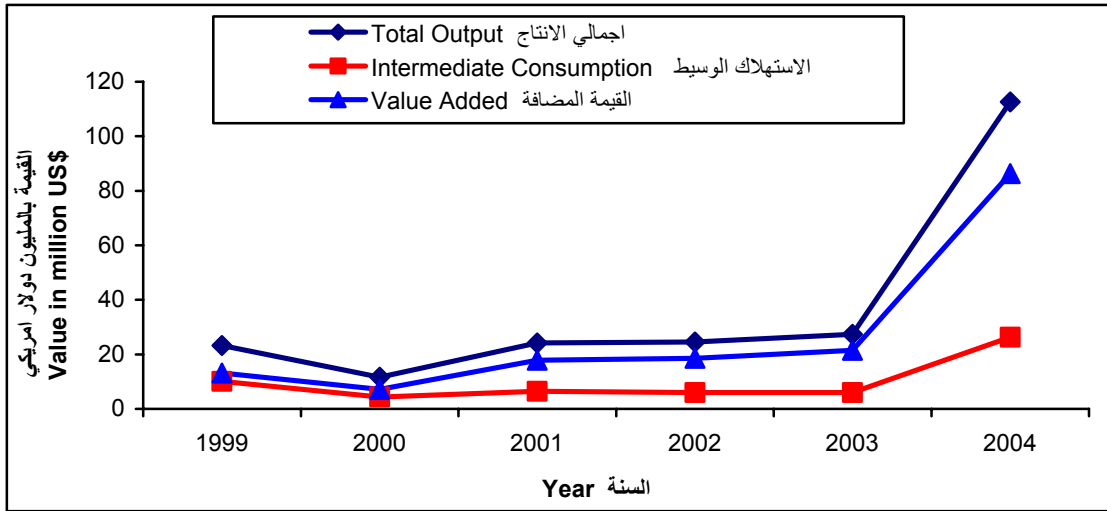

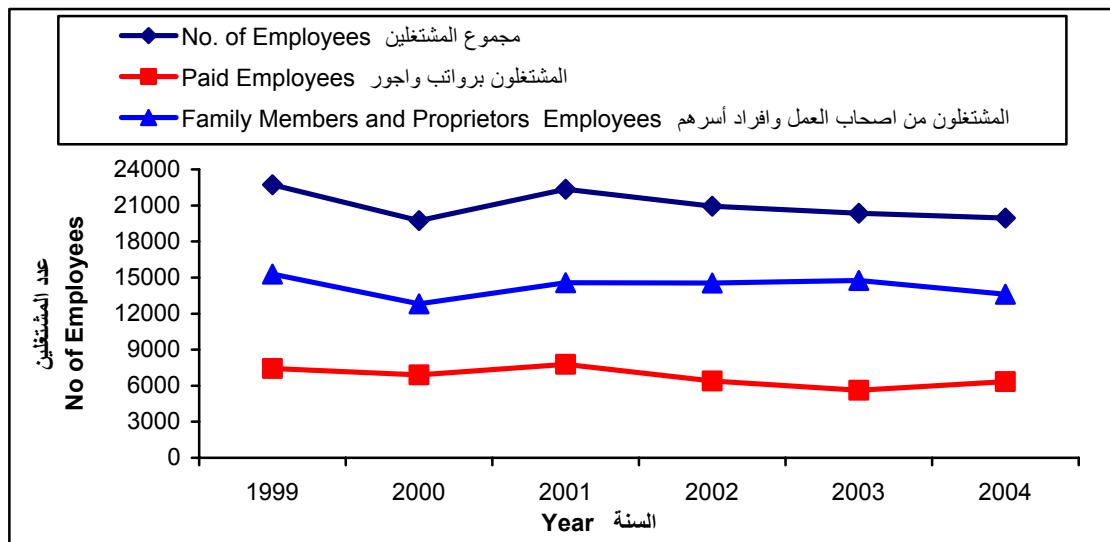

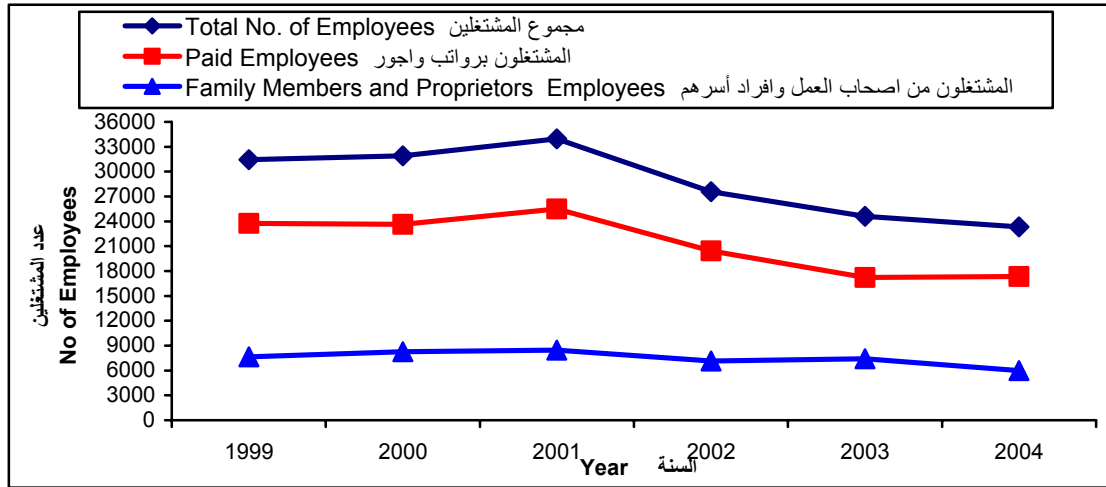

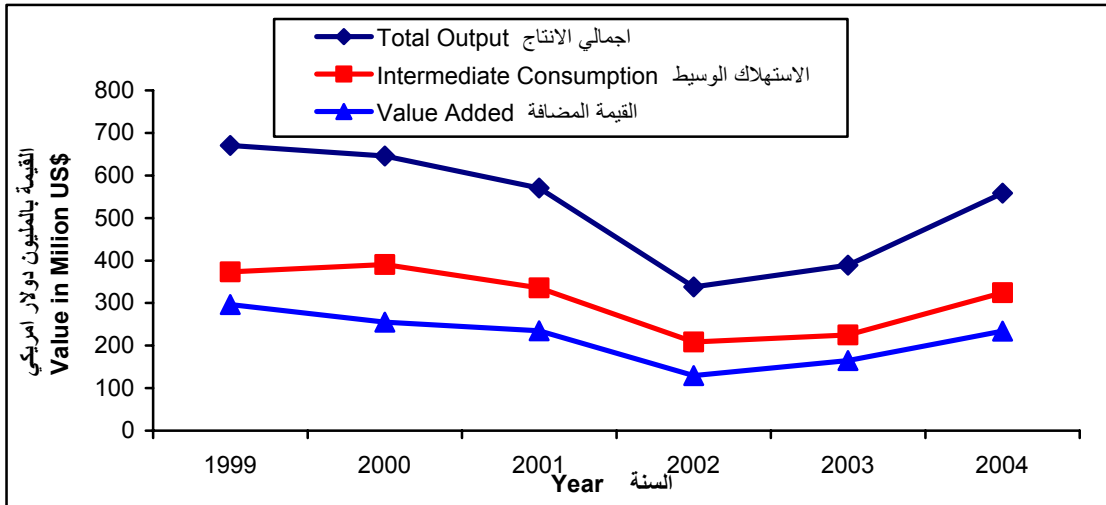

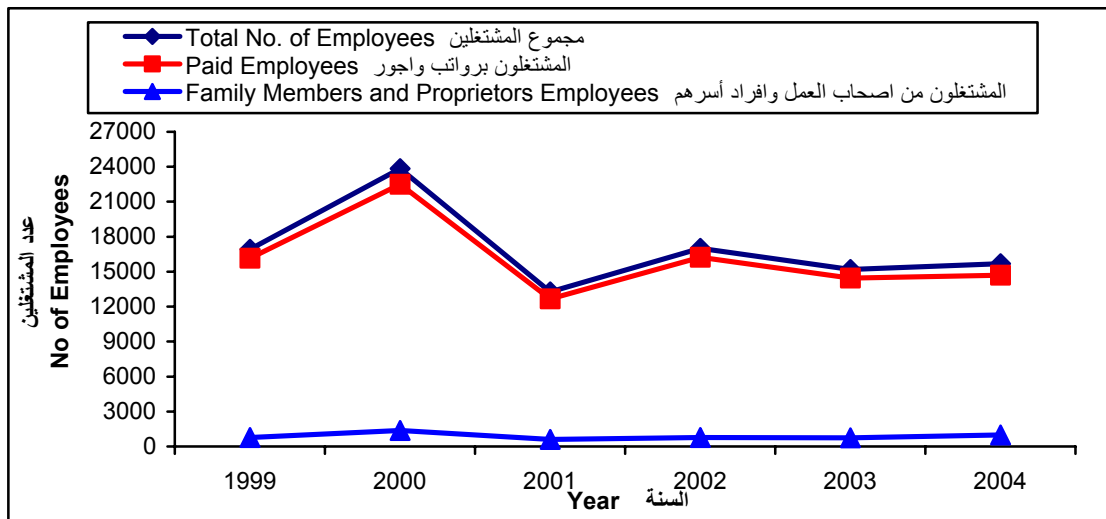

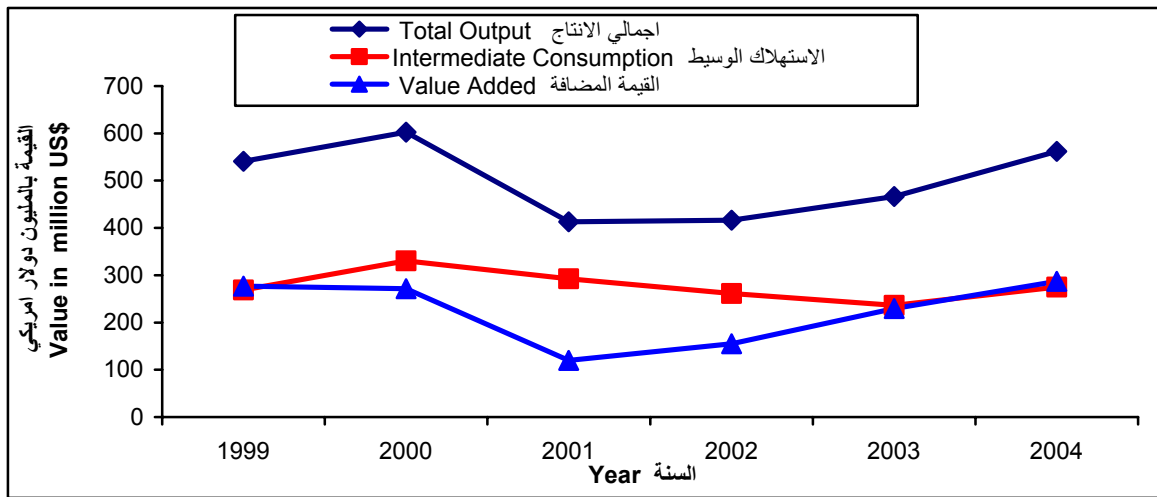

The results of Comparison Study 2004 indicate that there are 12,690 establishments working in industrial activities in Remaining West Bank and Gaza Strip employing 58,979 workers distributed as 91.4% males and 8.6% females. Out of them 65.1% as paid employees and 34.9% unpaid employees. The total compensation of employees amount to 161.2 million US\$.

The results indicate that total output amount to 1,460.1 million US\$, distributed as 93.5% from main activity and 6.5% from secondary activities. The value added reached 652.6 million US\$ representing 44.7% from total output, and fixed capital formation was 31.7 million US\$ while depreciations was 65.1 million US\$. Net investments was negative with 33.4 million US\$.

The exports reached 159.2 million US\$ which 10.9% from total industrial output.

comparing previous main indicators with 1999, it is clear that there is decline in number of industrial establishments with 13.4%, and 17.0% in number of persons engaged in same year for males and females especially for paid employees which decline with 18.9% causing decline in compensations with 24.2% and decline in annual compensation per paid employee from 4,486.7 in 1999 to 4,198.5 in 2004.

The output declined with 3.0% as result of the decline in number of persons engaged especially paid employee. and the decline in gross fixed capital formation with 3.0%.

The labor group employing (1-4 employees) had the biggest share in industrial establishments with employing 33.8% from total employment in industrial sector and most of them are unpaid employees(68.2% whereas 31.8% paid employees). The annual compensation per paid person amount to 3,332.5 US\$. It is noticed that this group represent 23.3% from total industrial output and 12.1% from total industrial exports.

The second labor group employing (5-19 employees) represent 23.2% from total establishments and 39.6% from total employment persons in industrial sector, most of them paid employees amount to (74.3% and 25.7% unpaid employees). ## Executive Summary

### Introduction:

The central statistical offices in most countries lay heavy emphasis on constructing sound database for all activities within the industrial sector. For the mentioned reason, it is taken into account to publish a descriptive study on the main industrial economic indicators.

The study's data is based basically on the main results of the industrial survey 1999–2004, through a track descriptive analysis for the main economic indicators, mainly the number of establishments, persons engaged, output, value added, intermediate consumption and gross fixed capital formation.

### Objectives:

The study aims to provide a descriptive analysis on the main economic indicators by:

- Labor group in main economic activities.
- Mining and quarrying activities.
- Manufacturing activities.
- Electricity and water supply activities.

### Methodology:

- Descriptive analysis of the industrial survey data 2004 by labor group (size of establishment).
- A comparison of the survey data, 1999–2004.

### Definitions:

- Establishment: An enterprise or part of an enterprise in which one group of goods and services is produced (with the possibility of having secondary activities).
- No. of persons engaged: This includes unpaid owners and family members, and paid employees both permanent and temporary.
- Compensation of employees: Wages, salaries and other allowances and remuneration in cash or in kind.
- Output: Value of goods and services, including own-account goods, produced during a specific period.
- Intermediate consumption: Value of production inputs from both goods and services.
- Gross value added: Output minus intermediate consumption.
- Gross Fixed Capital Formation (Investment): It is measured by value of acquisitions less disposals of new of existing fixed assets.
