Press Release on Labour Force Survey Results (July– September, 2003) Round 271,000 Unemployed persons during the 3rd quarter 2003

This report is based on the Labour Force quarterly Survey. Data was collected for the 30^{th} round from 05/07/2003 to 02/10/2003, representing the third quarter of 2003.

The survey sample of this round is based on the 1997 census, 7,563 households were selected to represent the Palestinian society of which 6,736 questionnaires were completed.

Economically Active:

According to the ILO standards, the number of participants in labour force increased by 25 thousand persons between the 2^{nd} and the 3^{rd} quarter 2003. Where it increased from 792 thousand in the 2^{nd} quarter to 817 thousand in the 3^{rd} quarter 2003, compared with 735 thousand in the 3^{rd} quarter 2000.

Unemployed Persons:

Number of persons who don't work nevertheless seeking or not seeking job, decreased from 302 thousand in the 2^{nd} quarter 2003 to 271 thousand in the 3^{rd} quarter 2003, compared with 170 thousand in the 3^{rd} quarter 2000. This represents 30.3% of the total labour force, according to the relaxed definition of unemployment.

While those who don't work, but seeking job, in the 3^{rd} quarter 2003 reached 193 thousand which represent 23.6% of the total labour force according to the ILO standards, compared with 24.3% in the 2^{nd} quarter 2003 and 10.0% in the 3^{rd} quarter 2000 (before the beginning of Al-Aqsa Intifada). The results showed that unemployment rate in the West Bank reached 21.6% in the 3^{rd} quarter 2003 compared with 22.4% in the 2^{nd} quarter 2003.

Unemployment rate by educational attainment, data shows that the rate was increased between the 2^{nd} and the 3^{rd} quarter 2003 it increased from 18.4% to 20.8% among those completed intermediate college and above.

Employed Persons:

The results showed a decrease in the percentage of employment¹ for those who are working in agriculture in the West Bank (14.7% in the 3^{rd} quarter 2003 compared with 19.4% in the 2^{nd} quarter 2003), while it was 11.3% in the 3^{rd} quarter 2000. Whereas in Gaza Strip the percentage remains at the same level (17.1%) in the 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} quarter 2003. Also the results showed that employment in construction increased in the West Bank from 8.3% in the 2^{nd} quarter 2003 to 11.2% in the 3^{rd} quarter 2003. While it decreased in Gaza Strip from 10.0% in the 2^{nd} quarter 2003 to 9.2% in the 3^{rd} quarter 2003.

The results showed decrease in the percentage of unpaid family members in the West Bank (from 13.3% in the 2^{nd} quarter 2003 to 11.3% in the 3^{rd} quarter 2003). while the percentage of unpaid family members remain at the same level (11.6% in the 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} quarter 2003 in Gaza strip). The results showed that the percentage for wage employees workers increased in the West Bank from 52.8% in the 2^{nd} quarter to 56.0% in the 3^{rd} quarter 2003, also the percentage increased in Gaza Strip from 62.1% in the 2^{nd} quarter to 63.1% in the 3^{rd} quarter 2003.

Employees from the West Bank working in Israel and Israeli settlements increased during the 3rd quarter 2003, they reached 59,000 persons compared with 50,000 persons in the

 2^{nd} quarter 2003, also the number increased in Gaza strip from 4,000 persons in the 2^{nd} quarter 2003 to 8,000 persons in the 3^{rd} quarter 2003.

Wages:

The average value of the nominal daily net wage of the employees in the West Bank increased from 72.1 NIS in the 2^{nd} quarter 2003 to 74.0 NIS in the 3^{rd} quarter 2003, compared with 70.3 NIS in the 3^{rd} quarter 2000. Also the nominal daily net wage of the employees in the Gaza Strip increased from 51.7 NIS in the 2^{nd} quarter 2003 to 52.2 NIS in the 3^{rd} quarter 2003, compared with 50.4 NIS in the 3^{rd} quarter 2000. The Average daily net wage for those working in Israel and settlements also increased from 121.0 NIS in the 2^{nd} quarter 2003 to 125.6 NIS in the 3^{rd} quarter 2003, compared with 110.8 NIS in the 3^{rd} quarter 2000.

Dependency Ratio and Poverty:

The economic dependency ratio² increased in the Palestinian Territory from 4.8 in the 3rd quarter 2000 to 5.9 in the 3^{rd} quarter 2003 (the change rate is 22.9%). Whereas, it increased in the West Bank from 4.3 to 5.3 (the change rate is 23.3%) and in Gaza Strip increased from 6.0 to 7.1 (the change rate is 18.3%). The ratio in the West Bank reached 6.5 compared with 7.4 in Gaza Strip in the 2^{nd} quarter 2003.

The percentage of employees whose monthly wages below poverty line³ increased from 43.5% in the 3^{rd} quarter 2000 to 60.8% in the 3^{rd} quarter 2003 (the change rate is 39.8%).

Child Labour:

Number of children aged 10-14 years participating in labour force (employed and seeking for job) increased in the West Bank from 6,371 child in the 2^{nd} quarter 2003 to 6,819 child in 3^{rd} quarter 2003, while in Gaza Strip decreased from 1,552 child in the 2^{nd} quarter 2003 to 1,441 child in the 3rd quarter 2003.

Press Release on Labour Force Survey Results (July– September, 2003) Round 271,000 Unemployed persons during the 3rd quarter 2003

This report is based on the Labour Force quarterly Survey. Data was collected for the 30^{th} round from 05/07/2003 to 02/10/2003, representing the third quarter of 2003.

Economically Active:

The results showed that the percentage for wage employees workers increased in the West Bank from 52.8% in the 2^{nd} quarter to 56.0% in the 3^{rd} quarter 2003, also the percentage increased in Gaza Strip from 62.1% in the 2^{nd} quarter to 63.1% in the 3^{rd} quarter 2003.

Employees from the West Bank working in Israel and Israeli settlements increased during the 3rd quarter 2003, they reached 59,000 persons compared with 50,000 persons in the

 2^{nd} quarter 2003, also the number increased in Gaza strip from 4,000 persons in the 2^{nd} quarter 2003 to 8,000 persons in the 3^{rd} quarter 2003.

Wages:

The average value of the nominal daily net wage of the employees in the West Bank increased from 72.1 NIS in the 2^{nd} quarter 2003 to 74.0 NIS in the 3^{rd} quarter 2003, compared with 70.3 NIS in the 3^{rd} quarter 2000. Also the nominal daily net wage of the employees in the Gaza Strip increased from 51.7 NIS in the 2^{nd} quarter 2003 to 52.2 NIS in the 3^{rd} quarter 2003, compared with 50.4 NIS in the 3^{rd} quarter 2000. The Average daily net wage for those working in Israel and settlements also increased from 121.0 NIS in the 2^{nd} quarter 2003 to 125.6 NIS in the 3^{rd} quarter 2003, compared with 110.8 NIS in the 3^{rd} quarter 2000.

Dependency Ratio and Poverty:

The economic dependency ratio² increased in the Palestinian Territory from 4.8 in the 3rd quarter 2000 to 5.9 in the 3^{rd} quarter 2003 (the change rate is 22.9%). Whereas, it increased in the West Bank from 4.3 to 5.3 (the change rate is 23.3%) and in Gaza Strip increased from 6.0 to 7.1 (the change rate is 18.3%). The ratio in the West Bank reached 6.5 compared with 7.4 in Gaza Strip in the 2^{nd} quarter 2003.

The percentage of employees whose monthly wages below poverty line³ increased from 43.5% in the 3^{rd} quarter 2000 to 60.8% in the 3^{rd} quarter 2003 (the change rate is 39.8%).

Child Labour:

Number of children aged 10-14 years participating in labour force (employed and seeking for job) increased in the West Bank from 6,371 child in the 2^{nd} quarter 2003 to 6,819 child in 3^{rd} quarter 2003, while in Gaza Strip decreased from 1,552 child in the 2^{nd} quarter 2003 to 1,441 child in the 3rd quarter 2003.
