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## Impact of the Israeli Measures on the Economic Conditions of Palestinian Households (7 th Round: October-December, 2003)

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### **Notice to users of this report**

PCBS would like to indicate to users of this report that classification of households according to their positions below or above poverty line is being determined on the basis of the information revealed by households about their income. PCBS warns against using this classification as a final one. PCBS indicates also that all information related to the value of humanitarian aid is also based on the reported data.

In fact, professional determination of poverty line and poverty prevalence is usually based on detailed studies about households' consumption and expenditure over an extended period of time using special methodologies and household surveys.

# Main Findings of the Survey on the Impact of Israeli Measures on the Economic Conditions of the Palestinian Households

# About 2.9 million Palestinians suffer from poverty, and 163 thousand of the Palestinian households lost more than 50% of their usual income

PCBS conducted the 7<sup>th</sup> round of the survey on the impact of Israeli measures on the economic conditions of the Palestinian households. Data collection was conducted during Fourth Quarter 2003.

The main objective of the survey is to continue monitoring the economic conditions of the Palestinian households and their standards of living as the Israeli measures continued against the PNA and the Palestinian people. This round of the survey is based on a random sample of 3,863 households, of which 3,863 households completed the interview. The completed interviews are distributed by region as 2,711 in the West Bank and 1,152 in the Gaza Strip.

#### Household's income:

Results indicate that the median monthly income in the Palestinian Territory has decreased from NIS 2,500 before *Alaqsa Intifada* to NIS 1,200 during 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter 2003. This decrease varies by region, the median monthly income decreased in the West Bank from NIS 3,000 to NIS 1,500 while in the Gaza Strip it decreased from NIS 1,700 to NIS 1,000.

Results of the survey indicate that 69.9% (414,000 households) of the Palestinian households decreased their income during *Al-Aqsa Intifada*, of which 39.5% (163,000 households) lost more than 50% of their usual income during *Al-Aqsa Intifada*, while 73.5% (286,000 households) of the households decreased their income in the West Bank compared with 63.0% (128,000 households) in Gaza Strip.

Comparing this result to the estimated poverty line during the Fourth Quarter 2003 (1,800 NIS for a household composed of two adults and four children) 71.9% of the Palestinian households (426,000 households) are expected to be living under the poverty line (about 2.9 million individuals). This rated at 65.9% in the West Bank against 83.0% in the Gaza Strip.

#### The Income Sources

Results of the survey indicate that the main income source of the Palestinian households during 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter 2003 was wages and salaries from private sector, (30.4%), followed by wages and salaries from public sector employment (18.5%), and from household's projects (10.5%).

#### **Coping Strategies**

The results indicated that during year 2003, 65.4% of the households (387,000 households) in the Palestinian Territory reduced there expenditure on basic needs, 67.2% in the West Bank and 61.9% in the Gaza Strip.

The results indicate also that 72.8% of the households took various coping measures during year 2003 depending on the monthly family income. This was manifested in reducing expenditure by 72.0% and delayed payment of bills by 68.0%.

The survey indicates that 24.4% of the households in the West Bank can cope with the situation for more than one year, comparing with 25.5% in Gaza Strip. 18.0% of the households in Gaza Strip, and 14.6% in the West Bank suffered from highly critical living conditions.

#### Humanitarian aid

Results show that 18.3% of interviewed households (108,000 households) reported that they received humanitarian assistance during 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter 2003, of which 15.1% in the West Bank and 24.7% in the Gaza Strip.

On the other hand, 70.0% of the households (414,000 households) reported that they need assistance, of which 68.3% in the West Bank and 73.3% in Gaza Strip.

About 19.1% of the households receiving humanitarian aid reported that the total amount of assistance received is less than NIS 100, while 47.1% of them have received less than NIS 200, 61.3% have received less than NIS 300.

However, the frequency of providing the assistance for households, relatives are rated highest rank at 24.4%, then comes UNRWA by 22.5%, while PNA by 16.7% and labour union by 9.1%.

The results reveal also that 49.4% of the total assistance is provided in the form of food supplies, and 33.9% in cash.

#### **Priority Needs of Households**

The results reveal that 34.5% of households reported the need for food as top priority during 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter 2003, while 23.2% of households reported the need for money and 20.2% of households expressed the need for work, and 9.2% of households expressed the need for education as their first priority, and 6.2% of households expressed the need for medicine as their first priority.

#### **Access to Health Services**

The results indicate that 60.2% of the households have access problem to health Services due to the Israeli closure, 49.0% of households because of cost of medical treatment, 62.4% of households because of military checkpoints and 12.3% of households because of the expansion and annexation wall.

#### **Concepts and Definitions**

#### **Closure:**

A set of measures have been practiced on land by Israeli occupation during Al-Aqsa Intifada, which affected and impeded the movement of persons and goods between Palestinian governorates or between Palestinian Territory and other countries. However, Israeli closure policy (total or partial) of all boarder points was a major obstacle.

#### **Total Income:**

The total amount of money and real incomes, which is earned by households, on monthly basis, regardless of its source.

#### Median:

The value above and below in which half total society the fall, the 50th percentile. If there is an even number of cases, the median is the average of the two middle cases when they are sorted in ascending or descending order.

#### Aid:

Any cash or real humanitarian aid, regardless of the source, that are received by households; due to the deteriorating living conditions, which resulted from measures taken by Israeli occupation forces during Al-Aqsa Intifada.
