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Press Release on Labour Force Survey Results (July-September, 2005) Round

Increased of Unemployed Persons by 9.0% between 2nd and 3rd quarter 2005

This report is based on the Labour Force quarterly Survey. Data was collected during 1/07/2005 to 30/09/2005, representing the 3rd quarter 2005.

The survey sample of this round is based on the 1997 census, 7,563 households were selected to represent the Palestinian society of which 6,729 questionnaires were completed.

Economically Active:

• According to the ILO standards, the percentage of participants in labour force increased by 1.2% between the 2nd quarter 2005 and the 3rd quarter 2005, where it increased from 41.2% in the 2nd quarter 2005 to 41.7% in the 3rd quarter 2005, compared with 43.5% in the 3rd quarter 2000. Also the participation rate of women increased slightly from 14.1% in the 2nd quarter to 14.2% in the 3rd quarter 2005 (the number increased by 2 thousand women).

Unemployed Persons:

- The percentage of persons who don't work nevertheless seeking or not seeking job, increased from 26.5% in the 2nd quarter 2005 to 28.4% in the 3rd quarter 2005, compared with 20.2% in the 3rd quarter 2000, according to the relaxed definition of unemployment.
- The percentage of persons who don't work, but seeking job increased from 21.2% in the 2nd quarter 2005 to 22.7% in the 3rd quarter 2005 according to the ILO standards, compared with 10.0% in the 3rd quarter 2000 (before the beginning of Al-Aqsa Intifada). The results showed that unemployment rate in the West Bank increased from 17.2% in the 2nd quarter 2005 to 19.9% in the 3rd quarter 2005, while in Gaza Strip it decreased from 30.2% in the 2nd quarter to 29.0% in the 3rd quarter 2005, despite of that unemployment rate in Gaza Strip still high.
- Jenin governorate registered the highest percentage of unemployment rate among the West Bank governorates which reached 26.0% followed by Salfiet governorate (25.4%) then Hebron (23.3%), while in Gaza Strip Gaza North governorate registered the highest percentage of unemployment rate 34.4% followed by Rafah governorate 33.9%.
- The results showed that the highest percentage of unemployment concentrated among the youth, the highest percentage registered for the age group 20-24 it reached 35.4% (31.1% in the West Bank compared with 44.0% in Gaza Strip), thereof 52.6% for women and 31.7% for men, followed by 15-19 age group it reached 31.8%, thereof 33.5% for men and 11.8% for women (29.8% in the West Bank 37.8% in Gaza Strip), then 25-29 group it reached 25.2% (23.6% in the West Bank compared with 28.4% in Gaza Strip), thereof 37.8% foe women and 22.1% for men.

Employed Persons:

- The results showed a slight increase in the number of employed persons between the 2nd and 3rd quarter 2005, the increased number of employed persons reached 657 thousand compared with 656 thousand in the 2nd quarter 2005 (the number in Gaza Strip increased by 4.5%, whereas in the West Bank decreased by 1.5%), also the results showed a decreased of employed women from 114 thousands to 108 thousands between the 2nd and 3rd quarter 2005 compared with an increase of 1.3% of employed men during the same period.
- The results showed a significant increase in the percentage of employment¹ for those who are working in trade, hotels and restaurants in the West Bank (20.0% in the 2nd quarter 2005 to 21.4% in the 3rd quarter 2005), whereas in (Agriculture sector (18.4%),

manufacturing sector (13.9%), Construction sector (10.1%) was the same percentage between the 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} quarter 2005). While the percentage increased in Gaza Strip of those who are working in Transportation, storage and communication from 4.2% in 2^{nd} quarter 2005 to 5.6%, and increased of those who are working in Services and other branches from 48.4% to 50.1% between 2^{nd} quarter 2005 and 3^{rd} quarter 2005.

- On the other hand, the results showed an increase in the percentage of unpaid family members in the West Bank (from 11.9% in the 2nd quarter 2005 to 13.0% in the 3rd quarter 2005), compared with a decreased of the percentage of self employed from 27.6% to 26.7% between the 2nd and 3rd quarter 2005, whereas in Gaza Strip the percentage of wage employees increased from 65.3% to 66.6%, compared with an decrease in the percentage of self employed from 23.1% to 22.0% between the 2nd quarter and 3rd quarter 2005.
- The employment from the West Bank in Israel and Israeli settlements remain at the same level 13.6% between the 2nd quarter and 3rd quarter 2005, while in Gaza Strip the number decreased to reach 1 thousand in the 3rd quarter while the number was 2 thousand workers in the 2nd quarter 2005.

Wages:

• The average value of the nominal daily net wage of the employees in the West Bank increased slightly from 73.9 NIS in 2nd quarter to 74.5 NIS in the 3rd quarter 2005, compared with 70.3 NIS in the 3rd quarter 2000. Also the nominal daily net wage for those working in Israel and settlements increased from 125.6 NIS in the 2nd quarter 2005 to 128.0 NIS in the 3rd quarter 2005, compared with 110.8 NIS in the 3rd quarter 2000. while the nominal daily net wage of the employees in Gaza Strip decreased from 60.7 NIS in the 2nd quarter 2005 to 59.9 NIS in the 3rd quarter 2005, compared with 50.4 NIS in the 3rd quarter 2000.

Dependency Ratio and Poverty:

- The economic dependency ratio² increased in the Palestinian Territory from 5.7 to 5.8 between the 2nd and 3rd quarter 2005 (the change rate is 1.8%). It increased in the West Bank from 5.0 to 5.1 (the change rate is 2.0%) while in Gaza Strip decreased from 7.7 to 7.5 (the change rate is 2.6%). The ratio in the West Bank and in Gaza Strip reached 4.3 and 5.9 in the 3rd quarter 2000 respectively.
- The percentage of employees whose monthly wages below poverty line³ increased from 56.6% in the 2nd quarter 2005 to 57.0% in the 3rd quarter 2005 (the change rate is 0.7%), while it reached 43.5% in the 3rd quarter 2000.

² The economic dependency ratio: Number of population *divided by* Number of employed persons.

Concepts and Definitions

Man power

All persons in the West Bank and Gaza Strip aged 15 years and over.

Reference week:

The week ending on Friday preceding the interviewer's visit to the household.

Employed:

All persons are 15 years and over who were working at a paid job or business for at least one hour during the reference week, or who did not work, but held a job or owned business from which they were temporarily absent (because of illness, vacation, temporarily stoppage, or any other reason) during the reference week. Employed persons are classified according to employment status as follows:

- 1. Employer
- 2. Own-account worker (self-employed)
- 3. Employee
- 4. Unpaid family member

Unemployed (According to the ILO Standards):

Unemployed persons are those individuals 15 years and over who did not work at all during the reference week, who were not absent from a job and were available for work and actively seeking a job during the reference week. Persons who work in Israel and were absent from work due to closure are considered unemployed, and also those persons never work and not looking for work but waiting to return back to their works in Israel and Settlements.

Unemployed (According to the Relaxed Definition):

The Number Of Unemployed Persons was calculated under the definition by adding to unemployed Persons according to the ILO Standards, those Persons outside labour force because they were frustrated

Labour force:

The economically active population (Labour Force) consists of all persons 15 years and over who are either employed or unemployed as defined above at the time of survey.

Underemployment:

Underemployment exists when a person's employment is inadequate in relation to alternative employment, account being taken of his/her occupational skills. The underemployed persons are classified into two groups:

- 1. Visible underemployment
- 2. Invisible underemployment

Persons outside labour force:

The population not economically active comprises all persons 15 years and over, who were neither employed nor unemployed accordingly to the definitions above.
