Press Release

On the Main Findings of the Survey on the Perception of Palestinian Population Towards the Socioeconomic Conditions, May 2004

Time series shows that optimistic levels still decreasing, especially in the terms of the overall well being of the households and the ability of the households members to move around.

Job creation and food needs still represent the first priorities of the Palestinian communities and households respictively

PCBS conducted the seventh round of the survey on the perception of the Palestinian people about the socioeconomic conditions. Data collection took place during the period 6/5/2004-20/5/2004 on a sample composed of 1,294 households, (947 in West Bank and 347 in Gaza Strip).

Current Situation

52.8% of the respondents reported that the overall well-being of their households is worse in May compared with a month ago (61.3% in the West Bank and 36.6% in Gaza Strip), while 5.1% reported that it is better (5.1% in the West Bank and 4.7% in Gaza Strip).

12.0% of the respondents reported that the ability of households members to move around is significantly harder this week compared with a week ago (13.2% in the West Bank and 9.9% in Gaza Strip), while 1.5% reported that it is significantly easier (1.7% in the West Bank and 1.0% in Gaza Strip).

Short-Term Expectations:

About 15.3% of the respondents expected that overall well being of households will be much worse in a month time (17.6% in the West Bank and 10.9% in Gaza Strip), against 0.6% expected that it will be much better (0.8% in the West Bank and 0.3% in Gaza Strip).

29.0% of the respondents expected that the ability of households members to move around will be harder next month compared with interviewing week (36.0% in the West Bank and 15.8% in Gaza Strip), while 11.1% expected that it will be easier.

21.2% of the respondents reported that they are very pessimistic to find a job next month, while 2.1% were very optimistic.

On the short-run expectations, time series since the end of 2003, shows that optimistic levels still decreasing, especially in the terms of the overall well being of the households and the ability of the households members to move around

Mid-Term Expectations:

About 18.5% of the respondents expected that overall well-being of households will be much worse in six months time (19.4% in the West Bank and 16.7% in Gaza Strip), against 0.6% expected that life will be much better (0.8% in the West Bank and 1.2% in Gaza Strip).

10.7% of the respondents reported that the ability of household members to move around will be significantly harder in six months time compared with interviewing week (13.5% in the West Bank and 5.6% in Gaza Strip), while 0.6% reported that it is significantly easier.

On the mid-run expectations, time series since the end of 2003, shows that optimistic levels still decreasing, especially in the terms of the overall well being of the households and the ability of the households members to move around

Priorities of households:

Data reveal that 41.2% of the households reported the need for food as a first priority, 20.0% the need for work, 19.7% the need for financial assistance, and 6.8% reported the need for health services, while 5.3% reported the need for educational services as a first priority.

Priority Needs of Communities:

About 51.6% of households reported the need for work, and 21.4% reported the need for infrastructure projects, and 8.3% for health services.
