Press Release

On the Main Findings of the Survey on the Impact of the Expansion and Annexation Wall on the Socio-Economic Conditions of Palestinian Localities where the Wall Passes Through in the West Bank, June 2008

- Percentage of Affected Localities by the Wall Increased by 15% since 2005, Percentage of Displaced Households Increased by 58% and the Closed Establishment has been Doubled.
- The Palestinian Authority Represents the Major Source of Assistance, but a decline in Localities Receiving Assistance from Palestinian Authority, Arab Countries and Private Sector, While UNRWA Expanded its Services.

The Palestinian Central Bureau of Statistics (PCBS) conducted a survey on the impact of the Expansion and Annexation Wall on the Palestinian localities that is Affected by Wall in the West Bank. The data was collected through meeting with the Local Authorities in the locality. Until the end of June 2008, nine governorates where affected directly by the wall: Jenin, Tubas, Tulkarem, Salfit, Qalqilia, in the north of the West Bank; Jerusalem, Ramallah and Al-Bireh in the middle; and Bethlehem and Hebron in the south. This survey is a part of the surveillance system to monitor the impact of the Expansion and Annexation Wall, in particular, and the impact of the Israeli measures on the well being of the Palestinian people, in general. Fieldwork took place during July 2008 and covered 171 localities.

Distribution of Affected localities by the Expansion and Annexation Wall

171 localities where the wall passes through until the end of June 2008 are affected compared with 149 localities until the end of May 2005. The distribution of localities where the wall passes through 2008; 32 localities in Jenin governorate, 27 localities in Jerusalem governorate, 21 localities in Hebron governorate, 22 localities in Qalqilia governorate, 20 localities in Ramallah and Al-Bireh governorate, 16 localities in Tulkarem governorate, 12 localities in Salfit, and 19 localities in Bethlehem governorate.

The main findings indicated that 14 localities are located behind the Expansion and Annexation Wall: 13 localities in the north of the West Bank (5 in Jenin, 7 in Qalqilia, and one locality in Tulkarem); and 1 locality in Bethlehem in the south of the West Bank.

157 of the affected localities are outside the Expansion and Annexation Wall compared with 134 localities until the end of May 2005. Distributed on Jenin and Jerusalem 27 localities for each, followed by 15 localities in Tulkarem, 15 localities in Qalqilia, 12 localities in Salfit, 20 localities in Ramallah and Al-Bireh, 21 in Hebron and 18 localities in Bethlehem, 2 localities in Tubas.

Confiscated and Isolated Land

The results showed that 49,291 dunums of land has been confiscated since the building of the Expansion and Annexation Wall until the end of June 2008, the majority of confiscated land was in the north of the West Bank; 22,141 dunums. Confiscated land in the middle of the West Bank was 13,875 dunums, and 13,275 dunums in the south of the West Bank.

Concerning Isolated land, the results showed that the area of Isolated land since the building of the Expansion and Annexation Wall until the end of June 2008 is about 274,607 dunums; the majority was in the middle of the West Bank, totaled 123,526 dunums, the area of Isolated land in the north of the West Bank is 89,498 dunums, and in the south is 61,583 dunums.

Displacement

The results indicated that 3,880 households were displaced from the localities that was affected by the Expansion and Annexation Wall since the beginning of construction of the Expansion and Annexation Wall until the end of June 2008 compared with 2,448 households were displaced from the localities since the beginning of construction of the Expansion and Annexation Wall until the end of May 2005, The total population of these displaced households was 27,841 compared with 14,364 in 2005.

Closure of Economic Establishments

The results indicated that the total number of closed economic establishments in the localities which was affected by the Expansion and Annexation wall is 3,551 establishments (2,197) in the north of the West Bank, 1,056 in the middle of the West Bank, 298 in the south of the West Bank)

Bypass Roads and Settlements on the Lands of the Affected Localities

Results showed that 96 of the localities where the wall passes through until the end of June 2008 reported that bypass roads were built on their lands compared with 60 localities until the end of My 2005, the 96 localities distributed by (9 localities behind the wall, 87 outside the wall).

On other hand, the results showed that 69 of the localities which have bypass roads located on their lands the roads were built before building of the wall, while 27 of the localities the roads were built after the construction of the wall.

Concerning the settlements, results showed that 92 of the localities where the wall passes through until the end of June 2008 reported that settlements were built on their lands compared with 60 localities until the end of My 2005, the 92 localities are distributed by (6 localities behind the wall, 86 outside the wall).

On other hand, the settlements were built before the wall construction in 85 localities, and in 7 of the localities, settlements were built after the wall construction.

Humanitarian Aid

Results showed that 107 of the localities which the wall passes through reported receiving humanitarian assistance during the last 12 months (10 behind the wall, 97 outside the wall).

However, regarding the frequency of assistance provided by the various sources for localities, public sector was mentioned in 68 localities, followed by the foreign institutions in 65 localities, then by Arab countries in 23 localities, UNRWA in 41 localities and the private sector in 17 localities.

Priority Needs of Households

The results revealed all localities affected by the Expansion and Annexation Wall (171 localities) reported the need for work in their localities as a top priority for these localities, and 169 of the localities reported the need for improving the infrastructure as a top priority for their localities, 163 of the localities reported the need for health services, financial assistants, educational services, and 161 of the localities expressed the need for food assistants in their localities.

Concepts and Definitions

Reference Period: There are four reference periods in this survey: 1. Since the beginning of construction of the wall until the end of June 2008. 2. Before and after building the wall. 3. During the last six months. 4. During the last 12 months. **Locality:** A permanently inhabited place, with an independent municipal administration or other type of adopted administration. Refers to the location of the locality or land **Location from Expansion and Annexation Wall** of the locality, or household from the wall: Includes all localities located between the 1. Behind the Wall: green line and the wall. 2. Outside the Wall: Includes all localities located outside the wall. **Area of Confiscated Lands:** The total area which was confiscated by Israeli occupation forces from the land of localities to construct the wall (usually taken by military order). **Isolated Lands:** The total area which was Isolated by Israeli occupation forces from the land of localities inside the wall (usually taken by military orders). **Displacement:** Enforced emigration due to war, occupation and foreign invasion of countries or as a result of catastrophe that results in displaced or deported original citizens from their home land to other, different places. The Establishments in different sectors **Closed Economic Establishments:** which were totally closed as a result of the wall. **Humanitarian Aid:** Any cash real humanitarian aid, regardless of the source, that is received by households because of the deteriorating living conditions due to measures taken by Israeli occupation

forces during the wall construction.
